For the Seljuk period, the journal welcomes research on the transformation of western Asia Minor from Byzantine to early Ottoman rule.** Emphasizing interdisciplinary and comparative frameworks, the journal publishes original research and critical reviews that contribute to current debates in the field. **A dedicated section also considers advisor-approved, unpublished parts of doctoral theses and archival reports that support broader academic exchange.** Translations, technical reports, and highly specialized material are not within the journal's purview.
